

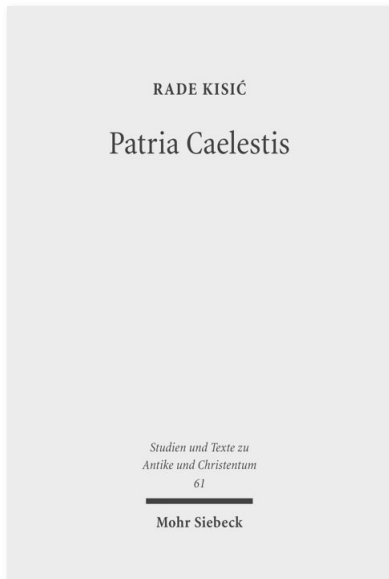

Die eschatologische Dimension der Theologie Gregors des Großen

The doctrine of Gregory the Great, the first monk on the papal throne, had a significant influence on medieval theology and particularly on Western mystical tradition. Against the backdrop of the collapse of the ancient civilization at the end of the 6th century, Gregory developed a theology which was rooted in the Latin tradition, had a strong eschatological orientation, and upon which the antithesis *temporalis - aeternus* had a determining influence. Rade Kisić discusses the eschatological dimension of Gregory's theology, which is fundamental to all aspects of his thinking. Its point of convergence is the *patria caelestis*, the »heavenly home.« His entire doctrine was shaped by his focus on the afterlife.
